

70 Artists Participating In Show for Student Union Fund

Appreciators of art will have the works of approximately 70 artists to choose from at the second annual Chi Omega Art Show and Sale for the benefit of the Marietta College Student Union Fund, to be held this Saturday and Sunday in the sorority's house at 300 Fifth St. A large variety of art media will be exhibited from 1-5 p.m., as well as an entire room of works selling for \$15 and under.

Three artists who have added their names to those already planning to exhibit or sell their works are Mr. Lindsey C. Foster of Pennsboro, and Mrs. Emma Penny and Ethel May Noland of Marietta.

Mrs. June Mele, a member of the Marietta Art League, plans to exhibit several oil paintings in the \$15 and under room. Mrs. Mele holds two R.S.O.A. certificates and has displayed her work in the Sydney Cooper Art College Exhibition, Canterbury, England.

Mrs. Robert F. Winbigler of Marietta, an exhibitor in the Cleveland May Show, Columbus May Show, Ohio Valley Oil and Water Color Show, Ohio Water Color Society Circuit Exhibition and Marietta Art League Show, will submit water colors and oils. Mrs. Winbigler belongs to the Ohio Water Color Society and Marietta Art League.

Another artist in the oil and water color field, Mrs. Robin S. Baker of Marietta, a member of the Marietta Art League, will exhibit some of her works. Mrs. Baker has shown her work previously in the AAUW Art Exhibits, the Ohio River Valley School of Painting, the Weber School of Painting, Washington

County Fair, where she won first place, the Columbus Gallery of Fine Arts and the 1955 Chi Omega Art Show.

Mrs. Bertha F. Hamilton of Marietta will display one of her oil paintings in the show. Mrs. Hamilton has exhibited in Marietta, Baltimore, Md., Akron and Youngstown, as well as a one-man show in Marietta.

Other oils will be submitted by Mrs. W. L. Schnauffer of Marietta, a member of the American Amateur Artists Association and the Marietta Art League and an exhibitor in the League's 1955 show.
